M(*inister*): In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **C**(*ongregation*): **Amen.** 

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Lutherans have historically referred to their weekly worship opportunities as the "Divine Service." This term has a double meaning. The primary function of weekly worship time is for the Divine (God) to serve us with his Word and Sacraments, and then the natural response is for us to serve the Divine with our loving, thankful hearts and lives. The Divine Service maintains for God's people a cycle of receiving from God his Gospel message in Word and Sacraments, and giving to God in return our prayer, praise, and thanksgiving for his free and faithful grace in Christ.

M: Christ is risen!

### C: He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

- M: Jesus Christ was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification.
- C: Since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God.
- M: Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

### C: In all things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.

- M: Death has been swallowed up in victory.
- C: Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.
- M: Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil, or fade.

### C: This inheritance is kept in heaven for us.

- M: Jesus is the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in him will live, even though they die.
- C: And those who live by believing in him will never die.
- M: I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth.

### C: I myself will see him with my own eyes—I, and not another.

M: Since you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God.

### C: When Christ, who is our life, appears, we will appear with him in glory.

M: Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen!

### C: Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.

M: This is the day the Lord has made.

### C: Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

- M: Christ is risen!
- C: He is risen indeed! Alleluia!


Silence for meditation and reflection

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> This canticle, the "*Dignus Est Agnus*" (Latin, "Worthy is the Lamb"), is taken from Revelation 5:12-13, 15:3, & 19:5-6. It seems to have its origins in American Lutheranism in the late 19<sup>th</sup> century, and has commonly been used during the Easter season in place of the *Gloria in Excelsis*. Jesus' Easter victory – and all the eternal spiritual blessings that come with it – fills us with worshipful praises toward the one who alone has proven himself worthy to receive them all.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> This salutation dates from the 2<sup>nd</sup> century AD and marks the beginning of the Word and Sacrament sections of the service. Here minister and members declare their unity in doctrine and practice and joyfully remember that when we gather together to worship our Savior-God, the Lord is truly with each of us in faith and in the Means of Grace, just as he promised: "For where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them" (Matthew 18:20).

### rightarrow The First Lesson: Acts 3:11–20

Peter healed a crippled beggar, drawing a large crowd. Peter used that opportunity to share a meaningful message about the one the people of Jerusalem asked Pilate to crucify.

<sup>11</sup> While the man held on to Peter and John, all the people were astonished and came running to them in the place called Solomon's Colonnade. <sup>12</sup> When Peter saw this, he said to them: "Fellow Israelites, why does this surprise you? Why do you stare at us as if by our own power or godliness we had made this man walk? <sup>13</sup> The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus. You handed him over to be killed, and you disowned him before Pilate, though he had decided to let him go. <sup>14</sup> You disowned the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. <sup>15</sup> You killed the author of life, but God raised him from the dead. We are witnesses of this. <sup>16</sup> By faith in the name of Jesus, this man whom you see and know was made strong. It is Jesus' name and the faith that comes through him that has completely healed him, as you can all see.

<sup>17</sup> "Now, fellow Israelites, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did your leaders. <sup>18</sup> But this is how God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, saying that his Messiah would suffer. <sup>19</sup> Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord, <sup>20</sup> and that he may send the Messiah, who has been appointed for you—even Jesus."

#### The Second Lesson: Romans 5:1-11

Christians have the meaningful message to share that because Christ died and rose for us, we have been justified through faith and so we have peace with God and hope for eternal life.

<sup>1</sup> Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, <sup>2</sup> through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we boast in the hope of the glory of God. <sup>3</sup> Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; <sup>4</sup> perseverance, character; and character, hope. <sup>5</sup> And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

<sup>6</sup> You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. <sup>7</sup> Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. <sup>8</sup> But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

<sup>9</sup> Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! <sup>10</sup> For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life! <sup>11</sup> Not only is this so, but we also boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

M: The Word of the Lord.

#### C: Thanks be to God.

(Sunday) The Gospel Acclamation: 1 John 1:7, 2:1-2<sup>4</sup>



- M: The blood of Jesus, God's Son, purifies us from all sin. If anybody does sin, we have an advocate with the Father—Jesus Christ, the Righteous One.
- C: He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world. *Refrain*

### ➡ The Gospel Lesson: Luke 24:36–49

The risen Savior gives us peace. He also gives us a mission. We are to share the message of repentance and forgiveness.

<sup>36</sup> While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you."

<sup>37</sup> They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. <sup>38</sup> He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? <sup>39</sup> Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have."

<sup>40</sup> When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet. <sup>41</sup> And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" <sup>42</sup> They gave him a piece of broiled fish, <sup>43</sup> and he took it and ate it in their presence.

<sup>44</sup> He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

<sup>45</sup> Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. <sup>46</sup> He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, <sup>47</sup> and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. <sup>48</sup> You are witnesses of these

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> In anticipation of hearing the good news about Jesus, we sing, "Alleluia!" (Hebrew for "Praise the LORD!") and speak a significant Scripture verse that highlights the importance of hearing the gospel message.

things. <sup>49</sup> I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

### C: Hear our prayer.

M: Stay by the side of all who are suffering. In your wise mercy, heal those who are sick, receiving treatment for illness, recovering from illness or surgery, or hurting in body or mind. *[We pray especially for...]* Remind them that your victory over death is a fact, and comfort them with your promise to raise them

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>7</sup> When the disciples asked Jesus' how to pray, he responded by teaching them this model prayer (Matthew 6:9-13, Luke 11:1-4). Primarily focusing throughout on spiritual needs rather than physical needs, we close our prayer with a "doxology" (a phrase of praise) which shows trust that God can and will do all we ask.





The congregation expresses their trust and confidence in the Triune God by responding with a hearty, "Amen," which comes from the Hebrew for "Yes, it shall be so!"
