The Invocation

M(*inister*): The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you. 2 Corinthians 13:14

C(ongregation): And also with you.

The Confession of Sins¹

M: We have come into the presence of God, who created us to love and serve him as his dear children. But we have disobeyed him and deserve only his wrath and punishment. Therefore, let us confess our sins to him and plead for his mercy.

C: Merciful Father in heaven, I am altogether sinful from birth. In countless ways I have sinned against you and do not deserve to be called your child. But trusting in Jesus, my Savior, I pray: Have mercy on me according to your unfailing love. Cleanse me from my sin, and take away my guilt.

M: God, our heavenly Father, has forgiven all your sins. By the perfect life and innocent death of our Lord Jesus Christ, he has removed your guilt forever. You are his own dear child. May God give you strength to live according to his will.

C: Amen.

The Prayer of the Day

M: Let us pray.

O God, you form the minds of your faithful people into a single will. Make us love what you command and desire what you promise, that among the many changes of this world, our hearts may ever yearn for the lasting joys of heaven; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.



¹ Why do our services always begin with the Confession and Absolution? As stark as the truths presented in this section are, they are all-important for a proper understanding of our relationship with God. The Biblical reality is that our sin separates us from God (Isaiah 59:2), but his forgiveness reconciles us to him (2 Corinthians 5:18-19). It would do us no good now or in eternity to deny our sins or pretend they don't exist. Rather, we come before God in honest repentance and faith, trusting that "whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy" (Proverbs 28:13).

The Word of God

☐ The First Lesson: Acts 4:32-37

In the early church, as the apostles preached the resurrection of Christ, the living Lord produced the fruits of unity and generosity.

³² All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had. ³³ With great power the apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. And God's grace was so powerfully at work in them all ³⁴ that there were no needy persons among them. For from time to time those who owned land or houses sold them, brought the money from the sales ³⁵ and put it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to anyone who had need.

³⁶ Joseph, a Levite from Cyprus, whom the apostles called Barnabas (which means "son of encouragement"), ³⁷ sold a field he owned and brought the money and put it at the apostles' feet.

Psalm of the Day: Psalm 63, CW:New Service Settings p. 24-26

☐ The Second Lesson: 1 John 3:18-24


St. John encourages us to demonstrate living faith in loving words and actions.

¹⁸ Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth. ¹⁹ This is how we know that we belong to the truth and how we set our hearts at rest in his presence: ²⁰ If our hearts condemn us, we know that God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. ²¹ Dear friends, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence before God ²² and receive from him anything we ask, because we keep his commands and do what pleases him. ²³ And this is his command: to believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as he commanded us. ²⁴ The one who keeps God's commands lives in him, and he in them. And this is how we know that he lives in us: We know it by the Spirit he gave us.

The Verse of the Day: John 15:52

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit. Alleluia!

² In anticipation of hearing the good news about Jesus, we say, "Alleluia!" (Hebrew for "Praise the LORD!") and speak a significant Scripture verse that highlights the importance of hearing the gospel message.

☐ The Gospel Lesson: John 15:1-8

Jesus is the vine who gives us, his branches, the ability to produce fruits of living faith.

¹ "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ² He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. ³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.

⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. ⁷ If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples."

Remaining in the Vine

The Apostles' Creed³

C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

³ The Creed is a basic summary of the Gospel message, the "good news" of what the Triune God has done for us to save us: God the Father created us; God the Son redeemed us; God the Holy Spirit sanctifies (makes us holy in God's sight) us through faith by the power of God's Word and Sacraments.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

M: By baptizing us into your name, you have connected us to your death and rising. You have put our sin to death and have given us a new life. Enable us each day to think of ourselves as dead to sin and alive to you, so that we may walk in newness of life in all we do. Lord, in your mercy,

C: Hear our prayer.

⁴ Here the congregation prays in response to the sermon and themes of the day, as well as about specific joys and troubles in our church, community, nation, and around the world.

M: In this fallen world, death and sorrow surround us. Touch the hearts of those who grieve the loss of a Christian they love. Direct their eyes to your empty tomb and ease their pain by reminding them that their loved ones will one day rise again. Lord, in your mercy,

C: Hear our prayer.

M: Lord, many people grieve without hope. Let the message of resurrection reach them and awaken faith in their hearts. Use us as your instruments to bring the word of life to their souls and the message of hope to their hearts. Lord, in your mercy,

C: Hear our prayer.

M: Stay by the side of all who are suffering. In your wise mercy, heal those who are sick, receiving treatment for illness, recovering from illness or surgery, or hurting in body or mind. [We pray especially for...] Remind them that your victory over death is a fact, and comfort them with your promise to raise them and give them and all believers new, glorified bodies like yours. Lord, in your mercy,

C: Hear our prayer.

M: Hear us, Lord, as we pray in silence. Silent prayer

M: Risen Savior, feed our faith with the message of your resurrection. Come to us in your Word and remain in us by faith, that we may live as branches in the Vine. Sustain and strengthen us until we feast with you in eternal glory.

C: Amen.

The Lord's Prayer⁵

C: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.

⁵ When the disciples asked Jesus' how to pray, he responded by teaching them this model prayer (Matthew 6:9-13, Luke 11:1-4). Primarily focusing throughout on spiritual needs rather than physical needs, we close our prayer with a "doxology" (a phrase of praise) which shows trust that God can and will do all we ask.




