M(inister): Christ is risen!

C(ongregation): He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

- M: As the sun rises on this new day, we gather to celebrate the rising of the Son of God from the dark night of death. Alleluia! Let us praise our living Lord!
- ✓ Opening Hymn: CW93#159, Morning Breaks upon the Tomb The hymn is printed on p. 10 in the service folder.

- M: [Jesus Christ our Lord] through the Spirit of holiness was appointed the Son of God in power by his resurrection from the dead. *Romans 1:4*
- C: He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification. Romans 4:25

- Now all the vault of heav'n resounds
 In praise of love that still abounds:
 "Christ has triumphed! He is living!"
 Sing, choirs of angels, loud and clear!
 Repeat their song of glory here:
 "Christ has triumphed! Christ has triumphed!" Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!
- M: Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life.
- C: The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die." John 11:25-26

- Eternal is the gift He brings, Therefore our heart with rapture sings: "Christ has triumphed! He is living!" Now still He comes to give us life And by His presence stills all strife. Christ has triumphed! He is living! Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!
- M: Oh, that my words were recorded, that they were written on a scroll,
- C: that they were inscribed with an iron tool on lead, or engraved in rock forever!
- M: I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth. And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God;
- C: I myself will see him with my own eyes I, and not another. How my heart yearns within me! Job 19:23-27

- O fill us, Lord, with dauntless love; Set heart and will on things above That we conquer thro' Your triumph; Grant grace sufficient for life's day That by our lives we truly say: "Christ has triumphed! He is living!" Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!
- M: When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory."

C: Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

M: Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you.
 Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain.
 1 Corinthians 15:54, 57-58

Mixed Choir Anthem: A Festive Introit for Easter


The prophet foresees the resurrection reality. The LORD would destroy the shroud of death and dry every tear from the faces of his people.

- ⁶On this mountain the LORD Almighty will prepare a feast of rich food for all peoples, a banquet of aged wine—the best of meats and the finest of wines.
- ⁷ On this mountain he will destroy the shroud that enfolds all peoples, the sheet that covers all nations;
- ⁸ he will swallow up death forever. The Sovereign LORD will wipe away the tears from all faces; he will remove his people's disgrace from all the earth. The LORD has spoken.
- ⁹ In that day they will say, "Surely this is our God; we trusted in him, and he saved us. This is the LORD, we trusted in him; let us rejoice and be glad in his salvation."

The Psalm of the Day: Psalm 30, CW:Supplement p. 43

The Congregation will sing the psalm together.





Sing to the LORD, you <u>saints</u> of his; praise his <u>holy</u> name.

To you, O <u>LORD</u>, I called; to the Lord I cried for <u>mer</u>cy:

"Hear, O LORD, and be merci<u>ful</u> to me; O LORD, <u>be</u> my help."

You turned my wailing into <u>danc</u>ing, that my heart may sing to you and not be <u>silent</u>.

Following the psalm, we pause in silent meditation to praise Jesus for his mighty victory; to thank our gracious God for the gift of our resurrection faith; to remember those brothers and sisters in Christ who have left this life; and to seek ongoing help and strength from the God of all grace to enable us to continue to run the race so that we might receive the crown of victory which has been stored up for us in heaven.

➡ The Second Lesson: 1 Corinthians 15:12-23

St. Paul explains that if Christ has not been raised, our faith is useless.

¹² If it is preached that Christ has been raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? ¹³ If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. ¹⁴ And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith. ¹⁵ More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God, for we have testified about God that he raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if in fact the dead are not raised. ¹⁶ For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised either. ¹⁷ And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins.

¹⁸ Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. ¹⁹ If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

²⁰ But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹ For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. ²² For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. ²³ But each in turn: Christ, the firstfruits; then, when he comes, those who belong to him.

The Verse of the Day: Psalm 118:24

The Congregation will speak the verse together.

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. Alleluia!

➡ The Gospel Lesson: John 20:1-18

The women and the disciples were crushed, because a dead savior is no savior at all. Christ's resurrection changed everything.

¹ Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. ² So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!"

³ So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. ⁴ Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵ He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. ⁶ Then Simon Peter came along behind him and went straight into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, ⁷ as well as the cloth that had been wrapped around Jesus' head. The cloth was still lying in its place, separate from the linen. ⁸ Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. ⁹ (They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.) ¹⁰ Then the disciples went back to where they were staying.

¹¹ Now Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb ¹² and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot.

¹³ They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?"

"They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him." ¹⁴ At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus.

¹⁵ He asked her, "Woman, why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?" Thinking he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him."

¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Mary."

She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means "Teacher").

¹⁷ Jesus said, "Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. Go instead to my brothers and tell them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.' "

¹⁸ Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news: "I have seen the Lord!" And she told them that he had said these things to her.

M: This is the Gospel of our Lord.

C: Praise be to our risen Christ!

Our Easter Confession of Faith

- M: What does Jesus' resurrection mean for you?
- C: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord.
 - He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned creature, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death.

All this He did that I should be His own, and live under Him in His kingdom, and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He has risen from death and lives and rules eternally.

This is most certainly true!


The Offering




