

Theme of Today's Worship:

Resurrection Reality: All Will Be Made Alive

Thank you for being with us today to celebrate Easter. Today is the highest festival in the Church Year, because on this day Jesus Christ rose from the dead to be our Savior. When Jesus came out of the tomb, he freed us from sin and the grave and forever defeated death and the devil for us. For nearly two thousand years, Christians have remembered this victory with the special Easter greeting:

"Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!"



The Order of Service

M(*inister*): In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C(ongregation): Amen.

M: Dear friends in Christ, upon the hill the cross now stands empty and morning light breaks upon the tomb. Today we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord.¹ Let us draw near to him in worship and in praise, in our thoughts and in our prayers.

Christ is risen!

C: He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

M: This is the day the Lord has made!

C: Let us rejoice and be glad in it!

Psalm 118:24

M: Come, let us worship!

The Opening Hymn: #441, v. 1-4, I Know that My Redeemer Lives

The Invocation

M: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

C: And also with you.

¹ The large Paschal Candle that you see standing at the front of church is a symbol of the resurrection of Christ and the hope for a resurrection to eternal life that Christians have because of it (Romans 6:3-11). This candle is lit throughout the Easter season and at every baptism and funeral, because it reminds us that when Christ rose from the dead on Easter morning, he brought the light of life to scatter the darkness of sin and death. Now just as Christ promised, "Because I live, you also will live" (John 14:19), so also the Christian rises, too – first spiritually in Baptism and then physically at the Last Day. The Paschal Candle is a constant reminder for us that Christ's victory is our victory.

The Confession of Sins

M: Dear friends, let us approach God with a true heart and confess our sins, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to forgive us.

C: Lord of life, I confess that I am by nature dead in sin. For faithless worrying and selfish pride, for sins of habit and sins of choice, for the evil I have done and the good I have failed to do, you should cast me away from your presence forever. O Lord, I am sorry for my sins. Forgive me, for Jesus' sake.

M: Jesus, by your resurrection from the dead, you were declared with power to be the Son of God.

Romans 1:4

C: Living Lord, have mercy on us.

M: Savior, you were delivered over to death for our sins and were raised to life for our justification.

Romans 4:25

C: Risen Christ, have mercy on us.

M: Jesus, you give us the victory over the law, sin, and death.

1 Corinthians 15:55-57

C: Living Lord, have mercy on us.

M: Savior, because you live, we also will live.

John 14:19

C: Risen Christ, have mercy on us and grant us your peace.

M: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. In his great mercy, God made us alive in Christ even when we were dead in our sins. The vacant cross and the empty grave are God's signs to you that he has accepted the sacrifice of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Therefore hear the word of God through his called servant: I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

Prayer and Praise

M: In the peace of forgiveness, let us praise the Lord.

Song of Praise: #511, v. 3, Crown Him with Many Crowns

C: Crown him the Lord of life, Who triumphed o'er the grave And rose victorious in the strife For those he came to save. His glories now we sing Who died and rose on high, Who died eternal life to bring And lives that death may die.

The Prayer of the Day

M: Let us pray.

O God, you made the dawn of this most holy day shine with the glory of our Lord's resurrection. Grant that we who have been raised from the death of sin by your life-giving Spirit may worship you in sincerity and truth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

C: Amen.

 ☐ The First Lesson: Job 19:23-27


By faith Job knew that because the redeemer lives, even though Job would die and his body would decay, he would see his God with his own eyes in the resurrection.

☐ The Second Lesson: 1 Corinthians 15:17-26

Christ gives us hope in this life, and Christ's resurrection gives us hope for eternal life to come.

¹⁷ If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. ¹⁸ Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. ¹⁹ If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

²⁰ But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹ For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the

dead comes also through a man. ²² For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. ²³ But each in turn: Christ, the firstfruits; then, when he comes, those who belong to him. ²⁴ Then the end will come, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father after he has destroyed all dominion, authority and power. ²⁵ For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. ²⁶ The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

☐ The Gospel Lesson: Mark 16:1-8

Early Easter morning, an angel explains to the women why they won't find Jesus' corpse in the tomb.

¹ When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. ² Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb ³ and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?"

⁴ But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. ⁵ As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed.

⁶ "Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. ⁷ But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you.'"

⁸ Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid.



The Sermon: Mark 16:1-8



The Apostles' Creed

C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Lord Jesus Christ, you have given us hope through your resurrection; the hope of life with you when you call us to yourself when this life is done.

This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

You are the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. You are the Living One, once dead, but now you are alive forever and ever. Come then, Lord, and help your people, bought with the price of your own blood. Bring us with your saints to glory everlasting.

This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

Just as the angels told the women not to be alarmed and comforted them with the news of your rising, comfort all who are alarmed or troubled, who struggle with fear, doubts, or illness *[especially...]*. With your Word of Life, give them strength, endurance, patience, and hope.

This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

Special prayers and intercessions may follow.

Hear us, Lord, as we bring you our private petitions.

Silent prayer.

O Lord Jesus Christ, you were put to death so that you would become the Author of life, and you were buried that you would rise from the grave. Just as you have forgiven our sins, constantly turn our hearts to you that we may enjoy your favor and goodness all the days of our life; you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one living God, now and forever. **Amen.**

The Lord's Prayer

C: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.


