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¹ The "order of service" outlines the progression of our worship activity here in God's house. However, the order of service is more than just an organizational tool. The order of service allows us to worship in a way that clearly presents the truth and character of God, who "is not a God of disorder but of peace" (1 Corinthians 14:33). Just as the courses in a holiday feast follow a proper progression, so also in this holy-day feast we follow an order of service where Christ first serves us in spiritual courses of Word and Sacrament, and we respond by serving him with our prayer, praise, and thanksgiving.

The Confession of Sins

M: If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.

C: If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

1 John 1:8-9

M: Let us confess our sins to the Lord.

C: Holy God, gracious Father, I am sinful by nature and have sinned against you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have not loved you with my whole heart; I have not loved others as I should. I deserve your punishment both now and forever. But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins with his innocent suffering and death. Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

Silence for meditation and reflection

M: Our gracious Father in heaven has been merciful to us. He sent his only Son, Jesus Christ, who gave his life as the atoning sacrifice for the sins of the whole world. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

☐ The First Lesson: Acts 9:36-42

Because Tabitha loved Jesus, she was always helping the poor in the town of Joppa. Because Jesus loved the people of Joppa, he had Peter raise Tabitha from the dead.

³⁶ In Joppa there was a disciple named Tabitha (which, when translated, is Dorcas), who was always doing good and helping the poor. ³⁷ About that time she became sick and died, and her body was washed and placed in an upstairs room. ³⁸ Lydda was near Joppa; so when the disciples heard that Peter was in Lydda, they sent two men to him and urged him, "Please come at once!"

³⁹ Peter went with them, and when he arrived he was taken upstairs to the room. All the widows stood around him, crying and showing him the robes and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was still with them.

⁴⁰ Peter sent them all out of the room; then he got down on his knees and prayed. Turning toward the dead woman, he said, "Tabitha, get up." She opened her eyes, and seeing Peter she sat up. ⁴¹ He took her by the hand and helped her to her feet. Then he called the believers and the widows and presented her to them alive. ⁴² This became known all over Joppa, and many people believed in the Lord.

² The "Gloria Patri" is a familiar phrase of praise that connects all of salvation history – Old and New Testament alike, for the psalmist just the same as for all of us today – by giving glory to the Triune God who created us, redeemed us, and sanctifies us for eternal life.

△ The Second Lesson: 1 John 4:7-11, 19-21

Since God so loved us first, we also ought to love one another.

⁷ Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. ⁸ Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. ⁹ This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. ¹⁰ This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹ Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

¹⁹ We love because he first loved us. ²⁰ If anyone says, "I love God," yet hates his brother, he is a liar. For anyone who does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love God, whom he has not seen. ²¹ And he has given us this command: Whoever loves God must also love his brother.

☐ The Gospel Lesson: John 15:9-17

The living Lord gives us this command: remain in his love, so that we might also love each other.

⁹ "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. ¹⁰ If you obey my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have obeyed my Father's commands and remain in his love. ¹¹ I have told you this so that my joy

³ In anticipation of hearing the good news about Jesus, we sing, "Alleluia!" (Hebrew for "Praise the LORD!") and speak a significant Scripture verse that highlights the importance of hearing the gospel message.

may be in you and that your joy may be complete. ¹² My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. ¹³ Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command. ¹⁵ I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶ You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit—fruit that will last. Then the Father will give you whatever you ask in my name. ¹⁷ This is my command: Love each other."

Jesus Is Our Best Friend Forever

The Nicene Creed⁴

C: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

⁴ Public Confession is faith's response to God's saving Word, in unity with other Christians around the world and across time. This statement of belief, called "Nicene" because most of its groundwork was laid at a church council in Nicaea in 325 AD, was composed to defend the Bible's teachings that both Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit are true God, equal to the Father in one eternal, undivided Trinity.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Sacrament of Holy Communion

The Preface⁵

M: The Lord be with you.

⁵ Along with the Word of God section, the Sacrament is the high point in our worship service because here God is at work for us, giving us his greatest spiritual gifts of forgiveness, new life, and eternal salvation. The words of the Preface mark the beginning of the Holy Communion section of the service and lift the worshipers' hearts in praise. This is not a somber procession – this is a thankful celebration! The opening sentences are among the oldest in the Christian liturgy, dating from the second century AD.


M: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

C: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

M: It is truly good and right that we should at all times and in all places give you thanks, O Lord, holy Father, almighty and everlasting God, through Jesus Christ our Lord, who by his willing sacrifice on the cross took away the sins of the world and by his glorious resurrection restored everlasting life.

Therefore, with all the saints on earth and hosts of heaven, we praise your holy name and join their glorious song:

Holy, Holy, Holy ~ Sanctus⁶



⁶ "Sanctus" is a Latin word that means "Holy." Like Isaiah (Isaiah 6:3), the heavenly angels (Revelation 4:8), and the Palm Sunday worshipers (Matthew 21:9), we are in the presence of the living God and witness his glory as Jesus comes to give us his very body and blood for our forgiveness. Used possibly as early as the second century, this canticle was in wide use among Christians in worship by the fourteenth century.

The Prayer of Thanksgiving

M: Blessed are you, O Lord of heaven and earth. We praise and thank you for sending your Son, Jesus Christ, and we remember the great acts of love through which he has ransomed us from sin, death, and the devil's power.

By his incarnation, he became one with us.

By his perfect life, he fulfilled your holy will.

By his innocent death, he overcame hell.

By his rising from the grave, he opened heaven.

Invited by your grace and instructed by your Word, we approach your table with repentant and joyful hearts. Strengthen us through Christ's body and blood, and preserve us in the true faith until we feast with him and all his ransomed people in glory everlasting.

C: Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

C: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.

The Words of Institution

M: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night he was betrayed, took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me."

The peace of the Lord be with you always.7

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⁷ After the Lord shared his Supper with his disciples, he made the same promise to them as he does now to us: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid... I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world" (John 14:27, 16:33).

The Distribution

God's Word tells us that Communion is an expression of complete unity of faith and confession with our God and with our fellow communicants. As such, our congregation and synod follow the historic Christian practice of Close Communion, celebrating the Lord's Supper only with those who have declared their agreement with us in doctrine and practice. We respectfully ask our visitors to wait to commune with us until we have studied God's Word together, so that we may all receive the Lord's Supper on that basis (as our Lord intends) and so be fully blessed through it.

⁸ Jesus is the Lamb of God (Latin, "Agnus Dei"), who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to take away the sin of the world (John 1:29). In his Supper, Jesus delivers that forgiveness to each of us personally.







- 1) May Calendar, Forward in Christ, & Meditations Available: Check the counter in the narthex if you'd like to get copies of your own, or check the Google Calendar link on our website!
- **2) 75**th **Anniversary Committee:** We have begun the 75th year of Good Shepherd's existence! We are looking forward to officially celebrating our 75th anniversary on September 21st, 2025 (tentative date), and we are looking for interested individuals who would like to plan special events and commemorative festivities. - 3) Communion Distribution Method Change: As of its meeting on April 15th, Church Council has decided that we will return to our traditional method of Communion distribution, in tables at the Communion rail (like on Maundy Thursday). Here are some basic instruction reminders:
 - a. Approximately 12 communicants will be ushered forward for each table, one on the east side and one on the west side. Please fill the tables starting on the outside first, and then fill in toward the center. The first tables can come directly to the rail; subsequent tables should approach from the center aisle, like normal.
 - b. Communicants will be invited to kneel at the rail, but are not required to.
 - c. After receiving the bread, communicants may take wine from the tray of individual cups or from the common cup.
 - d. The Communion blessing will be given to each table as they commune.
 - e. Communicants will return to their seats from the side aisles, in the same way as we have been doing up till now. For any other questions, please follow the direction of the usher(s).
- **4) WELS Seniors Dinner:** Area seniors 55 and older are invited to St. Stephen's Lutheran Church in Beaver Dam on Tuesday, May 14th. We will have a potluck dinner in the basement at noon. After the meal we will have a devotion, as well as a presentation by retired Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary professor John Brenner, who will speak about the seminary through the years. All those 55 and older are welcome.
- 5) Examination & Confirmation 2024: This year we are planning to welcome five young people as confirmed members of Good Shepherd. Examination will take place in our Wednesday evening service at 7:00pm on May 15th (NO Communion), and Confirmation will take place in our Sunday morning service at 9:00am on May 19th (WITH Communion). Following the Confirmation service, everyone is invited to celebrate with cake & refreshments in the Fellowship Hall. God bless this year's confirmands!
- 6) Summer Bible Study Schedule Change: Summer is coming, and that often brings schedule changes with it. The last day of Sunday School for this school year will be next Sunday, May 12th. Then after Memorial Day, our weekday Adult Bible study classes will take off for the summer (we WILL still normally offer a short Bible study after service on Sundays). But even though our schedule is changing, let's continue to prioritize growing in faith through regular worship and personal devotion time!
